**Subject: UNIVERSITY REGULATIONS**

It is notified that the **76<sup>th</sup> University Council** approved the following at its meeting held on **15<sup>th</sup> April, 2014** at Raj Bhavan, Jammu:-

- I. *Amendment in the following Regulations governing Jammu University Entrance Test for admission to the various academic programmes of the University/Offsite Campuses/ Private Affiliated Colleges from the academic session 2014-15 shall be replaced with the existing Regulations in **Chapter-XVI** of University Calendar, 2010, (Vol-I) (Resolution No. 76.20):*

Existing Regulations	Amended Regulations
i) Admission to the PG Departments of the University of Jammu, Jammu / Campuses / Affiliated Colleges shall be made on the basis of Entrance Test and Academic Merit of Qualifying Examination. The final merit of a candidate out of 100 shall be calculated by giving a weightage of 40 i.e. marks obtained in the Entrance Test and a weightage of 60 to the percentage of marks obtained in the qualifying examination- the 60 shall be calculated by giving the weightage of 20% each to the percentage of marks in Part I, II & III separately.	i) Admission to the PG Departments of the University of Jammu, Jammu / Campuses / Affiliated Colleges shall be made on the basis of Entrance Test and Academic Merit of Qualifying Examination. The final merit of a candidate out of 100 shall be calculated by giving a weightage of 40 i.e. marks obtained in the Entrance Test and a weightage of 60 to the percentage of marks obtained in the qualifying examination- the 60 shall be calculated by giving the weightage of 20 each to the percentage of marks in Part I, II & III separately. <b>The relative positive score of each candidate subject wise shall be taken into consideration for calculating final merit of the candidate. The relative score of the candidate shall be calculated as per the following formula:</b>  $\frac{\text{Marks obtained by the candidate in the Entrance Test}}{\text{Maximum marks obtained in that subject}} \times 40$ <b>To qualify the Entrance Test the candidate is required to obtain a minimum relative score of 14 out of 40 for general category candidates and a relative score of 12 out of 40 for candidates belonging to SC/ST/ST (residents of Leh &amp; Kargil) category.</b>

v) **Centres for Examinations:**  
JUET was conducted at different centres at Jammu City.

vi) Fee for the Jammu University Entrance Test (**JUET**) to be charged from each candidate shall be as follows:

e) Opting for <b>five</b> programmes	Rs. 1000/-	Rs. 850/-

v) **Centres for Examinations:**  
JUET – 2014 shall be conducted at the following centres:  
a) Jammu, b) Poonch, c) Bhaderwah & d) Leh.

vi) Fee for the Jammu University Entrance Test (**JUET**) to be charged from each candidate shall be as follows:

a) Opting for <b>one</b> programme	Rs. 500/-	<b>Rs. 250/-</b>
b) Opting for <b>two</b> programmes	Rs. 600/-	Rs. 500/-

- II. *Amendment in the following Regulation 10 of the Regulations governing procedure of admission to Ph.D programme which shall be replaced with the existing regulation in **Chapter-LVIII** of University Calendar, 2010, (Vol-II) (Resolution No. 76.24):*

10. The Course work should be completed in a period of each semester (45 contact hours spread over 90 working days). At the end of one semester the students shall be evaluated and if a student is not able to pass a course with 50% marks he/she shall be allowed to reappear in the examination in the subsequent semester.	10. The Course work should be completed during the period of semester (45 contact hours spread over 90 working days). At the end of semester the students shall be evaluated and if a student is not able to pass a course with 50% marks he/she shall be allowed to reappear in the examination in the subsequent semester.  <b>The minimum attendance for the Ph.D. Course work is 90% of the total lectures.</b>

- III. *Amendment in the following Regulation 5(d) of the Regulations governing Examination Maintenance Fund which shall be replaced with the existing regulation in **Chapter-XLI-B** of University Calendar, 2010, (Vol-II) (Resolution No.76.28):*

IV. Adoption of following amended Study leave Regulation which shall be replaced with the existing regulation in **Chapter-XXVII** of University Calendar, 2010, (Vol-I) (Resolution No. 76.47:

Existing Rule	Amended Regulation
Study Leave shall be granted by the Executive Council/Syndicate on the recommendation of the Head of the Department concerned. The Leave shall not be granted for more than three years in one spell save in very exceptional cases, in which the Executive Council/Syndicate is satisfied that such extension is unavoidable on academic grounds and necessary in the interest of the University/College/Institution.	Study Leave, duly endorsed by the Head of the Department concerned, shall be granted by the Vice-Chancellor, on the recommendation of the Standing committee as constituted for the purpose. However, action taken shall be reported to the University Syndicate for confirmation. The Leave shall not be granted for more than three years in one spell save in very exceptional cases, in which the University Council/Syndicate is satisfied that such extension is unavoidable on academic grounds and necessary in the interest of the University.
